Report from Nigeria

8th Nigerian Elders/Leaders' Seminar

During the weekend of April 6-8, 2012 another seminar was held in Kwale, Nigeria where various leaders assembled and led studies on appropriate topics. Following a welcome address by Bro. Moses Obire, Bro. Chuks Jacob's topic was, "An Intelligent, Loving Creator." Bro. Francis Edet's service was on "God's Revelation" and Bro. Godwin Edoja's theme was "Epoch of Time in God's Plan."

On April 7th, Bro. John Isife's lesson was, "Why God Permits Evil." Next, Bro. Donatus Onochie treated, "God's Judgment Day." Two Reprint studies chaired by Bro. Moses Obire, "The Spiritual Law" (R636) and "Falling Away from Steadfastness" (R2218) brought an end to this day's activities.

On April 8th, Bro. Donatus Ariwodor's subject was "Distinction between Heavenly and Human Natures." Thereafter, the final study, "Baptism and Its Import" (R1539) took up much of the balance of the day, followed by a short general question and answer session to close the seminar.

Report from Ghana

The following overview provides highlights of a visit to Ghana by brethren from America, D.R. Congo, Uganda, India, Cameroon, Kenya and Nigeria during various portions of February 2012.

Thursday, February 9th

Following an overnight flight from Kennedy Airport, Bro. Lee and Sr. Ila Hicks, Sr. Lynn Murray, Bro. Len and Sr. Gretchen Griehs, Srs. Gabriella and Estelle Wittbrodt, as well as Bro. Homer and Sr. Beverly Montague were met at the Accra Airport by Bros. Samuel Amoo, Edward Nkansah, Felix Daddah, as well as Sr. Sarah Asare. Additionally, Bros. Eliezer Jjuuko and Uucha Done from Uganda and Congo respectively arrived in Ghana shortly before the Americans. This group traveled several hours by van before reaching their destination in Kumasi.

Friday, February 10th

All of the aforementioned brethren plus Bro. Noah Amoo traveled by van for about four hours to Dewakrom. The ride was interspersed with the singing of hymns, discussions and viewing the surroundings as we looked through our windows. After reaching our destination, Bro. Amoo led a study on "What is a Christian?" Subsequently, Bro. Jjuuko spoke on "The Grace of God." There were at least 150 people in attendance. The brethren ultimately arrived in Kumasi for supper and rest after a very long day.

Saturday, February 11th

Following breakfast the brethren traveled to the class at Asoufua for a study on "The Antichrist" led by a young local leader. That evening Bro. Len Griehs gave a power point witness presentation outdoors.

Sunday, February 12th

At the Kumasi Ecclesia Sunday meeting, Bro. Homer Montague led a study on the Memorial. Subsequently, the group of travelers went to Dunkwa-on-Offin for a leaders' seminar. The first day of the seminar featured two studies by Bros. Griehs and Hicks respectively to round out the day.

Monday, February 13th and Tuesday, February 14th

The schedule for studies led by the Ghanaian leaders as well as a demonstration of witnessing techniques as scheduled occurred at the seminar hosted by Bro. Plange. When the seminar ended officially at 1:00 PM on Tuesday we decided to travel to Afransie for a study in the Western Region led by a local leader. Bro. Eliezer Jjuuko also gave a public talk to those in at-

tendance after the study was completed.

Wednesday, February 15th

Our group departed from Dunkwa for Accra and after a long ride, arrived at the Presbyterian Women's Centre, the site for the international seminar. In the evening we had supper and then retired for the day.

Thursday, February 16th

There were no formal activities scheduled for the day and some of the brethren went sightseeing and/or shopping. Additionally, pickups from the airport were arranged for Bros. Brian Montague, Khurrsino Miranda and Zablon Anyumba as well as Srs. Marvie Hackney, Sandy Koterba and Cathy Sandridge. When everyone was settled in, the brethren had supper and fellowship with one another.

Friday, February 17th

Following breakfast, all the brethren except Bro. Amoo traveled to Cape Coast. One group visited the Cape Coast Castle where information was presented concerning the slave trade and others who had been there before, attended studies led by three groups of brethren from the Cape Coast area classes. Subsequently, Bro. Khurrsino Miranda conducted a witness presentation on "The Mystery of the Cross." Finally, the brethren returned to the Women's Presbyterian Centre for supper, fellowship and rest. As mentioned earlier, Bro. Amoo remained behind and while the brethren were in Cape Coast, he went to the airport to meet Bros. Bob Goodman, Pius Were and also Sr. Gracia Reid.

Saturday, February 18th

The morning was devoted to sightseeing and shopping for those brethren who were interested in doing so in the Greater Accra area. In the afternoon, Bro. Zablon Anyumba received water immersion to symbolize his consecration at a service conducted by Bro. Len Griehs. In the early evening, the friends from Kumasi arrived at the Centre with Bro. Amoo and other brethren went out to a witness service conducted by Bro. Bob Goodman. After leaving the witness site, the Nigerian brethren met us and rode back to the Centre.

Sunday February 19th - Tuesday, February 21st

The Ghanaian/Nigerian seminar went exceptionally well and everyone present received many blessings. The brethren presented their topics effectively as per the schedule that was received. In particular, the symposium on "The Precious Promises" in which the 5 Ghanaian Pilgrims plus Bros. Adam and Noah Amoo participated was the first time they spoke on their own at this gathering. During one of the testimony meetings which the sisters did not attend because of the sisters' meeting where they made presentations on "Women in the Bible," Bro. Pius Were mentioned he had been jailed for his beliefs. Of special note during the seminar was the provision for Young Adult studies led by Bros. Bob Goodman and Len Griehs.

Wednesday, February 22nd

The Nigerian brethren departed early for home and arrived safely. There was a profitable meeting at the Centre with the Accra class prior to the brethren's departure for their respective destinations. Additionally, Bros. Lee Hicks, Edward Nkansah and Srs. Ila Hicks and Lynn Murray traveled to visit brethren in various parts of Ghana before returning to America.

Thursday, February 23rd - Tuesday, February 28th

Following an overnight stay at Bro. Adam's home in Dunkwa-on-Offin, Bro. Lee Hicks and his entourage visited the Western Region, Cape Coast, Winneba and returned to Accra. They evaluated the skills of various leaders in these regions with regard to their ability to lead studies effectively. Where appropriate, Bro. Lee gave discourses, provided encouragement to the friends and submitted his findings to the BSCFA Board of Directors. This information provided further insights as to how additional support could be given to the friends in these regions.

Testimonies from Brethren

It was incredible: I went to Africa - to Ghana - with Bro. and Sr. Montague. Traveling by bus and taxi along the bumpy, red dirt roads -- it's exactly how I imagined it, which made it surprising in a way. The first week, we held witness meetings at the various villages we visited all over Ghana. These meetings were filled with nearly everyone from each town. They dropped everything to come hear questions and fellowship with the brethren. I've never seen so much interest in the truth before! In the US, many people come to witness meetings to mock us or find faults in what we are saying. But in Africa, people care about it; they respect it. I can feel God blessing these people with the understanding of His plan. I can feel it and that feeling brings a smile to my face just like the smiles on the faces of the African children. They would shout, "Camera me! Camera me!" with their eyes filled with such joy. And it's not just the children that were running around filled with happiness. The adults working from seven in the morning until ten or eleven at night, seven days a week - were just as happy. No matter all the work they did, I never heard a single complaint. No one was upset or bored, just smiles on their faces and excitement in every act they did just excited to be alive. The last week was a seminar. Brethren from all over Ghana, Nigeria, Uganda, Congo, Kenya, Cameroon, India, America - we all came together with ears ready to listen to God's word, arms ready to hug God's people, and voices ready to sing praise to God. The singing was my favorite; everyone would sing loudly

with such enthusiasm. Harmonies were made up; some people were off key, but it didn't matter because they sang with such joy that it sounded beautiful. Everything, all of it - the lifestyle, the happiness, the interest and especially the excitement for learning God's truth - all of that helped me grow so much closer to God. I feel like a new person. I am a new person, for this experience has shown me our God and has allowed me to listen and respond to His calling. The consecration of my heart to my Father in heaven has brought me that same joy and excitement I found in Ghana; and I praise my Lord God for the blessing of finding it there. Asante!
