EAST AFRICA

The following is a summary of recent harvest activities in this location since the start of 2020 as reported by Bro. Eliezer Jjuuko of Uganda.

Malawi/Tanzania/Zambia Trip

On February 12th, I left Uganda and arrived in Malawi on the 13th met by Bro. Anthony Kapindula to follow up on Truth interests in that country. The following day, we began our studies with Bro. Anthony who originally had been a member of the Roman Catholic Church and came in contact with the 53 Lessons in 2014. Over the next several days I reviewed various

subjects with him and other individuals in Malawi including "The Three Ways," "Anti-Christ," "Revelation 18:4," "Christian Baptism," "Christian and Jewish Passover," and "Death and Resurrection." On February 17th Bro. Anthony symbolized his consecration through water immersion. I also invited him to attend the East Africa General Convention scheduled for later in the year.

After departing from Malawi, I spent time in various sections of Tanzania, first having studies with Isaya Ruhara and his wife—and subsequently with Bro. Bernardo Jordan and two pastors. The lessons I provided in this country between February 19th-23rd included most of the same areas (as described above) during my time in Malawi. I conducted an immersion service for Bro. Bernardo and also invited him to attend the East Africa General Convention presently scheduled for this summer.

Early on the morning of February 24th, I traveled to Zambia and because of safety issues in Kitawe, it was recommended that I sleep overnight on the same bus that transported me that far. With limited sleep the conductor took me to another bus headed for Solowezitown. While en route to our destination I had an opportunity to distribute tracts and ultimately was met by Samuel Mwebela, the pastor of a local Pentecostal Church. Throughout my several days of visiting various individuals in Zambia, I gave lessons similar to those

provided in Malawi and had many discussions with individuals who had shown interest in having Truth studies, remaining in Zambia until I departed for my home in Uganda and arriving on March 3rd.

Bro. Eliezer's expressions regarding his overall experience away from home acknowledged the prayers and support from those who enabled him to make these visits—by God's grace—with a desire to engage in yearly followup efforts to strengthen the new Truth interests as well as recommend study materials needed for believers at various levels (Psalms 18:1,2).

Kenya

They formed a committee that will translate Volume 1 into the local language and have appreciated pilgrim visits and seminars.

Uganda

WEST AFRICA

Nigeria

Ghana

The friends in Ghana have made excellent use of technology to have international gatherings of brethren-not only for the Memorial but also for regular miniconventions. It is a source of encouragement for all to learn that their Truth activities have seemingly intensified rather than diminished during this season of relative isolation from others. The following report prepared by Bro. Noah Amoo illustrated the fervency of these brethren in striving to meet together despite the challenges we face during this global pandemic. They have taken to heart this admonition from the Apostle Paul. "And let us consider one another to provoke unto love and to good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching" (Hebrews 10:24,25).

On the 24th of May 2020 from 9 AM to 11:30 AM, the Lord's people in Ghana both home and abroad were blessed with an online joint service which connected thirty brethren with active participation of twentyone. It was indeed a great blessing and joy for all who were able to participate. The Ghanaian government had placed a ban on all social, religious, political and all other forms of gathering since March 2020 due to the global corona virus pandemic. And so, hearing the voice of brethren near and far and realizing that each was still in good

health and zealous about the Truth brought consolation and encouragement to us all.

The telecommunication services in Ghana do not allow for a single telephone conferencing of more than five individuals at a time. The meeting therefore became possible because some individual brethren who are technologically inclined offered to connect others through a chain of conference calls. And those in very close proximity shared a device by placing it on loud speakers for everyone to hear and participate appropriately. No area in Ghana where the Truth had been received was left out. By the time the meeting was due to commence all the local brethren from Kumasi, Accra, Cape Coast, Dunkwa and the Western Area had been connected through the chain conferencing. Ghanaian brethren abroad from South Africa, the United States of America and the United Kingdom were connected WhatsApp conference calls. Their willingness to participate irrespective of the time difference was commendable.

The meeting's theme was "Love for the Brethren" and was based on 1 John 3:1-24. We began the fellowship with Hymns of Dawn (numbers 12, 23, 15 and 100). After an opening prayer, reading of devotions and expressions of greetings of love, the scriptures were read in both the Twi and English languages. Brethren who were willing and able to comment on the verses had



two turns to express themselves without time limits, beginning with the first twelve verses, then the second twelve. It was reported that those who were unable to share their thoughts and comments equally found the discussions stimulating and interactive. We encouraged each other through references to other Scriptures in the Bible, reading of sections of the Expanded Biblical Comments and admonitions and counsel. All of this was especially faith strengthening, even without face-to-face meetings.

We do not know when government restrictions and bans will be lifted. And after they are lifted, there still remain uncertainties with regards to how social gatherings and religious activities will be carried out in the midst of the global corona virus pandemic. Notwithstanding, we are committed to having such gatherings once a month and the next one was scheduled for the 21st of June with Colossians 3:1-25 as the scripture to be discussed. Our hearts are always with the brethren worldwide. We love you all and continue to remember you in our prayers. May our Heavenly Father continue to strengthen our hearts and bless our mutual efforts in making our "calling and election sure" (2 Peter 1:10).

SOUTH AFRICA

The brethren in South Africa are quite active in serving the Truth—despite not being physically in close proximity to each other.

Here is an overview prepared by Bro. Israel Loji regarding their endeavors.
