WEST AFRICA

The following is a summary of various harvest activities that have occurred in this area of the Lord's vineyard since the previous edition of this publication.

Nigeria

The 2019 Nigeria Bible Students Ecclesia Mission General Convention was held from Friday, August 23, to Sunday, August 25, 2019, at Central School Obudi Agwa Owerri Imo State Nigeria. Twelve ecclesias were in attendance. Its theme was taken from Philippians 2:5. The total attendees was 413 and 11 friends symbolized their consecrations. Nine brethren served as chairmen and testimony leaders. 1. Bro. Cajetan Eqbu welcomed brethren and spoke on "The Mind of Jesus Christ" and also gave the "Baptismal Discourse," 2. Bro. Benin

Nkansah. The final day of convention included a Question Panel, a Business Meeting and concluded with a Testimony Meeting. This blessed occasion was enhanced by visiting brethren in attendance from Nigeria and Togo.

Cameroon

Bro. Daniel Wozniak from France visited the brethren in Cameroon, commencing the last week of November 2019. Here is a brief report from him concerning his observations:

Monday, November 25, 2019

I arrived at the home of Bro. Alex and Sr. Paulena Mokom around 12:30 a.m. and slept well until I awoke around 6:00 a.m. Although there was no electrical power, I was made to feel most welcome and had a delicious breakfast. Throughout the day I took care of monetary exchange, shopping and becoming familiar with the Cameroonian economy and

culture. That evening I met about twenty brethren at the home of Bro. Alex as well as all the members of his household. We sang a dozen hymns and talked about the importance of a faith based on the Scriptures and the "Ransom," the "Soul," the "Trinity," as well as points that differentiate us from other movements. Unfortunately, there still was no power.

Tuesday, November 26, 2019

This afternoon we had a meeting at 5:00 p.m. Bro. Alex took me to see the mayor where we had an interview of 5 minutes. We then arrived at Bro. Bruno's house in Paki. We discussed the subject of faith. The meeting took place in a room belonging to the Pentecostals, and it was a room without electricity. At this meeting I was invited to make a presentation entitled "Powerless in the Face of a Situation." We returned to the home of Bro. Alex and enjoyed a good dinner prepared by Sr. Paulena in the dark.

Wednesday, November 27, 2019

Around 6:00 a.m. the power was restored. Almost all of the people live off their garden or jungle products. There is no economic activity in this area of Doume, so everyone has to be satisfied with their crops to survive. Much of the day was spent in various discussions with Bro. Alex.

Thursday, November 28, 2019

At 7:30 a.m. it was time for the children to go to school. Bro. Alex realized that the children might be late so he subsequently crammed 13 children into his car and drove them to school. We then visited various families with financial needs throughout the day and in the evening, about fifteen brothers came for a meeting in Kobila and then I led a service on "All Scripture is Inspired by God." The brethren sent their thanks for the greetings and for the gifts received.

Friday, November 29, 2019

After breakfast we went to Bertoua to meet a Pentecostal sister whom Bro. Bruno knows very well. We spoke for a good hour and presented to her all the arguments that contradict the "Trinity" and "Hellfire." Bro. Bruno gave her a first volume that she wanted to read before taking a stand. Later Bro. Alex took us to visit the Pygmies. In the evening after supper, Bro. Alex had a study in his home with the children on Hebrews 2:9,thus bringing a wonderful day to a close.

Saturday, November 30, 2019

At 10:00 a.m. we traveled to Paki for a meeting. The small children are numerous. I presented, in a few words the story of David and Goliath. Subsequently, I gave a presentation on our Christian responsibility. As is customary here, the meeting ended with questions. We then answered seventeen of them fairly quickly and left around 6:00 p.m.

Sunday, December 1, 2019

Several brethren traveled all night to come to this meeting, yet they are all in good spirits. At 10:00 a.m. the meeting started with the activity of the children. Sr. Paulena had all the children sing in chorus and by heart. I chose to speak to them on the shortest verse of the Bible: "Jesus Wept." Bro. Bruno followed me and discoursed on "Faith and Knowledge." After lunch some brothers presented short talks encouraging the brethren and young people to walk in a dignified manner and to strengthen their faith through the knowledge of God's Plan. The sisters also expressed great happiness after being taken out of darkness and into the light of Truth.

Monday, December 2, 2019

It's the day of departure and we left at 8:00 a.m. to avoid driving during the hottest period. I have fond memories of this trip. It taught me how grateful we should be to the Heavenly Father for whatever He gives us. I was very well received and noticed a great solidarity among the brethren and love—but also the great need they have for our help, both spiritually and materially.

Pilgrimage to Three Countries

From December 3 through December 22, 2019, Bros. Khurrsino Miranda of India and Edward Nkansah from Ghana traveled to meet individuals in Benin, Burkina Faso and Sierra Leone who were introduced to the Truth previously or had demonstrated interest in God's Plan through various leads that were supplied by brethren in America. As part of an ongoing effort to assess the receptivity of contacts in each of the above-mentioned countries to have visitations, responses to the "53 Lessons" and participation in WhatsApp groups, were determining factors for instituting this pilgrim journey. From December 3-9, there were several sessions conducted in Benin with Bro. Emmanuel Okorie and those of his fellowship to provide instruction in better understanding the Scriptures. A follow-up plan was developed for completing the "53 Lessons" as well as subsequent Volume studies and the use of additional materials associated with the Harvest Message. After departing from Benin, Bros. Khurrsino and Edward flew Burkina to Faso and subsequently were met there by Bro. Sergino Kpoedzou of Togo for a few days, primarily to assist with issues of translation because some of those being witnessed to had French as their native tongue. Since this was the initial visit to Burkina Faso by the brethren, it was agreed to begin a WhatsApp Bible Study classroom commencing in January so that the newcomers receiving the Truth could continue to make progress. When the brethren finally departed from this second stop, they felt that although they had come as strangers, they were leaving with hearts full of blessings because of the reception received. As Bro. Sergino went back to Togo, Bros. Khurrsino and Edward traveled on to Sierra Leone where they remained between December 15, through 22, 2019. On the first evening there was an opportunity to witness to a group between 20-25 individuals at a church where the reception was *electric!* The attendees indicated they wanted more studies so a follow-up WhatsApp group will be formed. Most of the remainder of Bros. Khurrsino's and Edward's very productive time was spent with two individuals named Solomon Kamara and an elderly Pastor, Christopher Swarray, who runs a school and had previously participated in about 80% of the "53 Lessons" in a WhatsApp group. Among the in-depth studies considered with him during this visit were the "Jubilee Law," "Trinity," "Christ's Second

Coming" and "Chronology." The two pilgrims are watching for the Heavenly Father's leadings to determine the possible fruitage that may result from this eventful journey of three weeks' duration.

EAST AFRICA

East and Central Africa Convention

The East and Central Africa General Convention was held in Kampala, Uganda, as reported by Bro. Eliezer Jjuuko commencing with presentations on August 29, 2019, led by elders on the subject of "Our Calling" to friends who benefit the were newly consecrated. Most of the brethren departed for their homes on September 2, 2019. The theme of this gathering was from 2 Corinthians 7:1. The attendees hailed from Zambia, South Sudan, Kenya, Tanzania, D.R. Congo, Rwanda, Uganda as well as Bro. Mark Chastain from the USA. There were various studies as well as three panel discussionsplus a symposium where there were opportunities for brethren to speak and manifest their teaching skills. As a highlight, there was a special service on the final day when five newly consecrated brethren symbolized their immersion into Christ through water baptism. Much gratitude through testimonies was expressed towards the Oakland County brethren in America who provided temporal and spiritual support in order to enhance everyone's growth in Christ.
