Greetings from the BSCFA

We see no end to momentous events that are exploding around the world. Beginning from May 2020 through 2022 countries experienced governmental travel lockdowns especially on international borders over the concerns of the spread of COVID. Life was starting to return to normal, then Hamas attacked Israel on October 7, 2023. What we have seen is a rise in antisemitism worldwide. The far left has aligned themselves with the terrorist group Hamas. A possible explanation of this union is deeply rooted in a historical misapprehension on who owns the land in Israel and Satan's continued ploy to exterminate the Jewish people.

What we want to focus on is Cause and Effect concerning world events. The cause of the COVID lockdowns and not being able to meet together in person, precipitated brethren figuring out an alternative way to meet together. This was accomplished by Zoom and additional electronic means of communication. This has opened up doors that previously were not available. Brethren now have the opportunity to communicate with brethren from around the world.

What might be the Cause and Effect of the current situation of increased antisemitism? People are becoming more polarized in their opinions toward one another. This polarization is leading to increased strife and discontent among people. An additional

Cause and Effect of Antisemitism is making Jews uncomfortable in countries which they live and the consequences of this might be that many Jews will make Aliyah to Israel. This is supported by Old Testament scriptures.

What should our demeanor be while we see all this trouble in the world? When possible, help clarify the historical misapprehension regarding Israel and the land. It's God's land and God's people. We as brethren need to strengthen one another in the most holy faith. How is this done? This is done by continuing to meet and encourage one another. Stay focused on building and strengthening the body of Christ, Hebrews 10:25: "Not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." 

Pan African Convention Diary

Wednesday, March 27, 2024

On Wednesday, March 27, 2024, after greeting one another with hugs and warm fellowship, Bros. Richard Doctor, Brendan Getchel, Stanley Hart, Matt Kerry, Brian Montague, Homer Montague and Richard Warner as well as Srs. Rene Blanks, Joanna Blecharz, Carina Butler, Karen Earl, Karen Getchel, Sonya Hart, Cathy Sandridge and Marva Warner boarded a flight from JFK Airport to Accra, Ghana and safely arrived to the Kotoka International Airport in Accra, Ghana the following early afternoon.

Thursday, March 28, 2024

The friends were met by Bros. Edward Nkansah, Sergino Kpoedzou, Felix Afantchawo, Samuel Lepkor as well as the convention photographers. Shortly thereafter Bro. Israel Loji, Srs. Rose Jeanet Katunga and Merrylene Zivanomoyo's flight arrived and they joined the group in a waiting bus. After a long ride to the Presbyterian Women's Centre, the travelers had dinner and extended fellowship before having a night's rest.

Friday, March 29, 2024

After breakfast, some of the brethren remained at the PWC to decorate the meeting hall, while others attended a public witness effort conducted by Bro.

Matt Kerry. Those who remained at the PWC welcomed brethren who arrived throughout the day for the convention. At supper, Bro. Homer was surprised when the friends celebrated his 90th birthday.

Saturday, March 30, 2024

The brethren gathered into the meeting hall and received an envelope with the program, the names of all the attendees, a pen and pad, name tags and tracts. The services included a welcome address, theme discourse, mini talks on Daniel 7 and the Ancient Worthies. Questions also were posed. Additionally, a panel with a question/answer session and a Sisters' testimony meeting were featured. The evening ended with the distribution of snacks and other useful items for all of the African and Indian brethren.

Sunday, March 31, 2024

The remainder of the day consisted of a group photograph, a Brothers' testimony meeting and a devotional on Christ's Resurrection. Battery packs and water purifiers were distributed as well as eyeglasses.

Monday, April 1, 2024

The day continued with a panel discussion and mini talks on Daniel 7 and the Ancient Worthies with follow up questions from the audience. There was also a second Sisters' testimony meeting. Following Songs in the Night, some of the left-over items previously distributed as well as clothing were placed on a back table for the brethren to take.

Tuesday, April 2, 2024

The final half day included the closing discourse, group photos, concluding remarks and a beautiful vespers service. The brethren ended the convention with the emotional singing and farewell hugs of God Be With You.

Wednesday, April 3, 2024

Many of the brethren departed on this day. The afternoon featured touring for those who remained, visiting an outdoor market and a shopping mall. Eventually those who were traveling home, were taken to the airport. By 7 PM, the Americans returned to the PWC for an early night's rest before their trip to the airport early the following morning.




